Objective

This advanced-level training provides an in-depth understanding and first-hand experience of the ICC Arbitration procedure under the 2012 ICC Rules of Arbitration. It is based on the renowned arbitrators in a multicultural and international environment.

A practical case-study approach and role-plays will be used to address a series of situations that arise during complex arbitral proceedings so that you gain the expertise and competence to prepare for an arbitral proceedings under the new ICC rules: from drafting the request and the answer, to preparing the witnesses, to simulating an arbitral hearing, etc.

Who is it for?
