## “Doing business and resolving disputes with China”

Each year ICC Australia, which is an affiliate of the International Chamber of Commerce, holds a series of seminars on international commercial dispute resolution across the major cities in Australia. The purpose of the seminars is to examine the latest developments in international commercial dispute resolution, in particular, international arbitration.
