



Introductory comments :

Following the success of its 1st edition, the CMAP (Centre of Mediation and Arbitration of Paris) renews its Mediation Competition. The event, which is intended for French speaking students, will take place on March 17th and 18th, 2010 in the premises of Négocia (17th district-Paris)

This Competition, realised in conditions as realistic as possible, was created to allow the students to improve their skills with a practical mediation experience.

Because of its success last year, you are encouraged to register to the Competition as soon as possible, and especially on or before November 30th, 2009.

A closing cocktail will be held at the Chamber of commerce and industry of Paris at the end of the Competition.

Competition Description:

During the Competition, students, enrolled in legal Master's degrees, from business schools and from the Law Schools will test their skills on the subtle exercise of mediator.

Students can apply to the Competition individually or as team.

Each student will be put in the mediator's situation in presence of two parties played by professionals (representatives of the business world, lawyers, magistrates, expert-accountants, etc) A third professional will be present as observer. Scoring will be made in co-operation between these three persons.

The mediation sessions will be conducted in accordance with the rules of the CMAP. The students will be judged according to a scoring sheet which will be communicated to them together with the Competition problems.

The Competition will take place on March 17th and 18th, 2010 in Paris

THE AWARDED PRIZES:

1st prize : one session of business mediation training of 56 hours with the CMAP;
2nd prize : one internship in a partner law firm; and
3rd prize : one internship with the CMAP.
Numerous reference books will also be distributed.
