

## Geoffrey Gamble

Geoffrey Gamble is Director of International Government Affairs of the DuPont Company and a member of its Legal Department. His responsibilities include leading DuPont's global government affairs network, the development of corporate trade policy and providing legal counsel in the areas of international and comparative law, trade law, and global ethics. For eleven years he was Chairman of the U.S. Industry Trade Advisory Committee for Chemicals, Pharmaceuticals, Health/Science Products and Services to the Department of Commerce and to the United States Trade Representative. He is Chairman of the Business and Industry Advisory Committee (BIAC) Trade Working Group, and Chairman of the Trade Advisory Committee of the International Council of Chemical Associations (ICCA). He is a member of the Executive Committee of the U.S. Council for International Business. He is also a member of the Board of Directors of the National Foreign Trade Council. He attended the Seattle, Doha, Cancun, and Hong Kong World Trade Organization Ministerial Meetings as a U.S. Delegate and Advisor. He is Vice President of Malteser International, a disaster relief organization.

Mr. Gamble is a graduate of Brandywine High School in Wilmington, Delaware. He received his BA from Haverford College in Haverford, Pennsylvania, and his Juris Doctorate from the Catholic University School of Law in Washington, DC.

Mr. Gamble is a member of the Bars of the State of Delaware (1976) and the District of Columbia (1975). He has served as President of the Delaware State Bar Association (2006-2007). After a judicial clerkship in the District of Columbia, he began the practice of law as an associate with the Wilmington firm of Killoran & Van Brunt. He joined the Legal Department of the DuPont Company in 1976. He has been a lawyer for DuPont for the past thirty-three years where he has practiced as a commercial attorney, Asia Pacific Regional Counsel in Hong Kong, Senior Attorney, Administrative Assistant to the General Counsel, Managing Counsel, Chief International Counsel and Associate General Counsel. He is a member of the Board of Overseers of Widener University School of Law.

Mr. Gamble is a Republican and has served as President of the Kennett School Board, Chester County, Pennsylvania, and as President of the Delaware St. Thomas More Society of Lawyers. Mr. Gamble was formerly a captain in the United States Marine Corps. He served in Vietnam in 1969-70 and was awarded several combat decorations, among them the Vietnamese Cross of Gallantry with Bronze and Silver Stars, five Air Medals, and the Navy Commendation Medal with "V" for valor. He also received a Vietnamese Presidential Citation for establishing a school and orphanage in Dong Ha, South Vietnam. He holds three ecclesiastical knighthoods. He is a Knight of Honor and Devotion of the Sovereign Military Order of Malta, a Knight of the Holy Sepulchre, and a Knight of Justice of the Constantinian Order of St. George. He is a Director of Catholic Charities.

Mr. Gamble and his wife have seven children and four grandchildren and reside on a farm near Wilmington, Delaware USA.
